EPS Nominees for Board of Directors – 2021

NORMA ADAMCZYK: I was born in Daytona Beach, moved to Enterprise in 1943, and have lived most of the time in my grandmother's house in the historic district with two dogs, and Koi fish. I've been an active board member of EPS for many years, and was part of a core group who painstakingly worked to refurbish the Enterprise Heritage Center. I also chair the Adopt-A-Road Committee. I'm a member of the Volusia County Orchid Society; Florida East Coast Koi Club; and Barnett Memorial United Methodist Church. In addition, I have been a volunteer for the University of Florida Institute of Food & Science and collect water samples from Green Spring and Gemini Springs for the University of Florida Lake Watch Program for over 20 years. I was honored to be a 2012 nominee for the Johana Knox Award for Community Service Excellence.



DOUG deLEON: I grew up in Houston, TX. In 1979, I joined the United States Navy. I flew aircrew on the P-3 Orion Antisubmarine aircraft as an inflight technician who was responsible for the avionics equipment onboard the aircraft. I am currently retired and having fun being a musician and playing in various groups across the area.

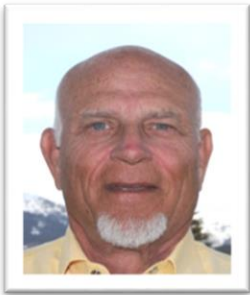
